Course Overview

There is no prerequisite for Instrumental Tech 1 & 2. In order to be enrolled in Instrumental Tech 3, a student must have passed Tech 1 & 2, or have teacher permission.

This class is intended for those students wishing to learn to read music, to play an instrument for the first time, or for those who are trying to learn a secondary instrument. After successfully completing this course, the student will be able to display knowledge of instrument care, instrument characteristics, performance techniques such as tone control and phrasing, understand music notation and vocabulary and demonstrate evaluative skills as a listener and a performer.

Books

We will use several books in this class depending on your individual level. We may also use other sheet music and different types of materials.

Grading

Classroom Policies

Students should behave as if they were in any other academic class. Attendance

Absences and tardies will be handled in the same manner as listed in the student handbook. You must have an excused admit in order to make-up any work you may have missed. Classroom Participation

Each student must have a pencil, assigned music and instrument in class each day. Students are to provide their own instruments for this course. Any student having an instrument that is not in working condition, for any reason, will not be allowed to use it until it is repaired. In addition to having these items in class, a student must also be actively participating in order to receive a satisfactory "class participation" grade.
